The new building of NLT was constructed on the same area and opened on October 3, 2011. The NLT has renovated the building 1 (the old building) to be remodeling of the building for comfortable and suited for modern lifestyle with new library services technology. The building has been opened since October 12, 2017.

The NLT holds the main function for acquisition, collecting and preserving of Thai intellectual and culture heritage of information resources in form of printed materials, audio-visual, electronic materials and ancient manuscripts. The library represents a National Depository, International Standard Books Number (ISBN), International Standard Serials Number (ISSN) and Press Act A.D. 2007.

The Editorial Board of ISU hopes that the cover of this issue represents the importance of documenting and preserving knowledge for our descendants. Likewise, we sincerely believe that Thai urologists must keep striving to improve their knowledge in the same way in order to enhance their treatment and practices.
